Gospel Reading - Mark 9:30-37

Jesus teaches his disciples that the greatest are those who serve all.


In today's Gospel, we hear Jesus again predict his passion, death, and Resurrection to his disciples. The setting here is important. Jesus and his disciples are preparing to journey through Galilee, a Jewish territory in which Jesus has already encountered problems with the Pharisees. Perhaps this is why Mark indicates that Jesus was trying to journey in secret.

Mark paints a vivid picture in today's Gospel. Having arrived at Capernaum, Jesus and his disciples enter a house. In this private place, Jesus asks his disciples about the argument they had while they were journeying. Again, the disciples are uncharacteristically silent and afraid to answer. They have been found out. Jesus then summons the Twelve, whom Mark identified earlier in his Gospel as those chosen by Jesus to preach and to drive out demons. To this select group of disciples, Jesus teaches that those who would be first in God's kingdom must be servants of all.

Jesus then calls forward a child and teaches the Twelve that to receive a child in Jesus' name is to receive both Jesus and the One who sent him. We might easily fail to understand the significance of this action. In first-century Palestine, children were without status or power, possessing no legal rights. In this action, Jesus is teaching his disciples and us that when we serve the least ones among us, we serve Jesus himself. Who are the people without power or status in our society that Jesus is calling us to serve? Do we do so willingly? Jesus teaches that God's judgment of us will be based on this criterion alone.

Family Connection


As you gather as a family, recall a recent family argument about household chores or an example of bickering among family members. Talk about what was at issue in the argument. Together imagine that Jesus entered the room just as the argument ended. What would you tell Jesus your argument was about? What might Jesus say in reply? Read together today's Gospel. How was your family argument like the argument among Jesus' disciples? What might your family do to remember that those who are great in God's kingdom are those who willingly serve others? Pray together that your family life will reflect your commitment to serve one another with love.



Stewardship - "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all." (Mark 9:35)

Jesus teaches us that we are called to love one another. Love involves sacrifice. Sacrifice is a word that many of us don't like to hear. We think it means that we must give up something that we want. However, the literal meaning of sacrifice is "to make holy," from the words "sacer" = sacred and "facere" = to make. In other words, we make our lives holy by sharing our gifts in the service of God.

Intendance - « Si quelqu'un veut être le premier, il sera le dernier de tous et le serviteur de tous. » Marc 9 : 35

Jésus nous enseigne que nous sommes appelés à nous aimer les uns les autres. L'amour implique des sacrifices. Sacrifice est un mot que beaucoup d'entre nous n'aiment pas entendre. Nous pensons qu'il signifie que nous devons renoncer à quelque chose que nous voulons. Pourtant, le sens littéral du mot sacrifice est "rendre saint", à partir des mots "sacer" = sacré et "facere" = faire. En d'autres mots, nous rendons notre vie sainte en partageant nos dons au service de Dieu.

Évangile selon saint Marc 9, 30-37

Jésus traverse la Galilée un peu en secret, car il évite les rassemblements. Il se contente d'instruire ses disciples en leur parlant de sa Passion qui se prépare. Lorsque Jésus se tait, eux, ils continuent de parler en marchant. Ils devraient partager ce que Jésus leur a dit, mais ils ont un tout autre sujet de discussion: Lequel sera le plus grand dans le royaume de Jésus? Jésus le sait bien, mais s'il les interroge, c'est pour nous enseigner que la vraie grandeur est dans le service. Il est toujours étonnant de penser que les disciples de Jésus, après avoir entendu ses graves avertissements au sujet de sa Passion, oublient si vite et s'entretiennent futillement entre eux de la priorité de l'un ou de l'autre. Pourtant, nous leur ressemblons étrangement quand nous faisons passer nos intérêts personnels avant ceux du monde et de Dieu dans le monde. Afin de mettre ses disciples ambitieux dans la vérité, Jésus appelle un enfant, Il l'embrasse et leur dit: « Celui qui accueille un enfant comme celui-ci, en mon nom, c'est moi qu'il accueille. »

Mille occasions se présentent de rendre service dans la vie quotidienne. Souvent, ce sont de petites choses que nous serions portés à mépriser, mais ce sont ces petites choses de rien qui peuvent faire grandir. Rendre service en secret, sans recevoir le merci auquel nous aurions droit, c'est imiter vraiment le Seigneur.

The year 2021 is dedicated to Saint Joseph, Patron of the Universal church

The Vatican announced that 2021 would be a year dedicated to St. Joseph, husband of Mary and earthly father of Jesus Christ. The announcement coincides with the 150th anniversary of the proclamation of St. Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church by Pope Pius IX on December 8, 1870.

But a celebration of St. Joseph and a call to focus on his patronage is particularly relevant in this time of universal turmoil when so many are having difficulty finding employment, when we are becoming more aware of how much we owe to so many ordinary, hardworking people, and when our human frailty and mortality are so much in our minds and in the news. The Church reminds us that we have a powerful ally in Heaven who, having lived and worked in the shadows for so long like so many unsung heroes, is both Patron of Workers and Patron of a Happy Death.
